Comm Williams – The Highlands Borough Arts Council came back into the picture and would like to promote our workshop. This helps make it clear it is open to everyone. A white board is an item of interest to the tenants for promoting ongoing events, a type of reminder board.

Renee - September Vacancy Report: 0 vacancies at Ptak and JPM. 8 residents on the Ptak waiting list and 135 non-residents. 5 residents on the JPM waiting list and 81 non-residents.

OFFICERS & STAFF REPORTS

ED Dzema – At the last executive committee meeting we spoke of inviting T-Mobile, cellular antenna carrier to our next meeting. They weren't ready for this meeting so we are looking to have them come for our October 23rd meeting; changing the start time to 5:30pm. They are interested in posting an antenna on our roof to expand their bandwidth. They would like to make a presentation to the board and the residents. Then if they get the go ahead here, they would go to the borough zoning board to move forward. Atty Bonello is helping me negotiate a lease with them, they are offering a monthly fee to the housing authority. T-Mobile will send out a sales rep and an engineer and you and the board can listen to them and ask questions. Doug Sabey gave his presentation last month with the RAD projects. We are moving forward with a number of the job with our architect, getting ready to go out for bid on a number of the prime jobs. Our part time administrative assistant has resigned to take on a full time position at another entity; we have already advertised the position and have a number of resumes to review and will be interviewing.

PUBLIC PORTION -

Vickie Cooke, apt. 208 – The T-Mobile thing, is there a cost to the tenants? Basically they are just putting up an antenna for the entire town? Is it cellular service, computer service, television? **EDDzema** – There is no service being offered to the tenants. There is no cost to the housing authority, they will be paying us. The money we receive will be spent on the building. They may be bouncing the signal off of Sandy Hook, it may be the local area; I am not sure. It is broadband, T-Mobile.

Larry Wallace, apt. 206 – Could T-Mobile benefit us with installing Wi-Fi throughout the building? I mean because the housing authority is going to keep the money it is going to get for the antenna, how is it going to benefit the tenants? **EDDzema** – That is a question that should come up next month. I would expect that the board would be using the money back on the property.

Gerdana Young, apt. 309 - I am questioning about that back door (side), it is a killer for people with walkers getting up the hill and in the door. Could we get an automatic entrance like we have on the other doors? **EDDzema** – That is not a handicap accessible exit/entrance. That is not a bonafide ramp or entrance. What you need to do is use the front or back entrance/exit of the building, those are handicap accessible.

Larry Wallace, apt. 206 - I know for years this question has been asked about cable, if the housing authority is going to give T-Mobile permission for an antenna to be put on the roof, why couldn't there be a satellite dish put on the roof for the benefit of the tenants? **EDDzema** - Again this is something that we can discuss when they come by.

Gloria Miller closed the public portion.
