<u>FY25-009</u> – Resolution to approve the introduction of the operating budget for the Housing Authority of the Borough of Highlands for fiscal year ending June 30, 2026.

ED Dzema – This will be the introduction of our budget for FYE 2026. We did have a meeting with the finance committee as we do every year, to make sure the budget is in line with what the board is thinking, to make sure we are not over budget, to make sure we have a surplus. That meeting was on March 11 with Chair Miller, Comm Messina and Comm Francy; along with our CFO, Tom and Brian Furlong. We discussed the results FYE 6/30/24, the seven-month report for 1/31/25 and Tom went over every budget item line by line so the committee members could go over it and discuss it in depth. We did not need a secondary meeting, although we did have to revise it. Tonight is the introduction of the budget and upon your vote, we will send it to the DCA for their review/comments and then we bring it back to the board for adoption in May. The budget does call for a surplus. I did request a 3% salary increase for all employees from the board, when I did have this conversation with the committee they thought differently, since the average was 3.5% across housing authorities, they considered a 4% increase for the staff. This was the revision. Tom Furlong – HUD requires you to be at least a 20% reserve level and maintain between 20 and 40% reserve, you are at 132%; three times what HUD requires. That is very healthy. I thank the board for all the support they showed me over the years.
